

STOP. Is this email a scam?

Read this before you click anything.

Fake "unpaid invoice" and "reminder" emails are made to scare you into clicking. Slow down and check these five things first.

☐

1. Does it say you owe money or must pay fast?

Scammers use fear and hurry on purpose. **Being rushed is a warning sign.**

☐

2. Do you actually remember this bill?

If you never ordered from this company and don't recognise the invoice, **it is almost certainly fake.**

3. Look at the sender's email address.

Does it really match the company name? A strange address that doesn't fit means **do not trust it.**

☐

4. Do not click the button or the link.

Not even "just to check." One click can be enough. **If in doubt, don't click.**

☐

5. Never type a password or bank details.

Real banks and companies never ask for this through an email link. **Never enter it.**

When in doubt: do nothing and ask.

Call the company using a number you already have, not the one in the email.

Or ask a family member you trust before you do anything.
